The claim was brought under 42 U.S.C. §1983, which provides a cause of action when someone is deprived of a federal constitutional right "under color of law," i.e., by state action. There is no violation if the official lacks actual authority to speak on behalf of the government and/or the posts were made in the official's personal capacity.
